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Board's Message

Celebrating 30 years of existence was a major milestone for Instituto Reciclar in 2025. It is a pleasure to look back on this year and see that we achieved results that honor our history of social impact. In this edition of our Activity Report, we invite you to learn how we transform lives through youth education and workforce development.

We believe in the potential of young people because we know they are our present and our future. Behind every trained young person and each result achieved is a network of partners, donors, and professionals who share a commitment to building a fairer world with more opportunities for all.



The year 2025 was even more special as we expanded all of our projects. The Educational Program began serving two cohorts (now including young people trained during the morning shift), reaching 332 participants with high-quality training focused on their economic inclusion. The employability rate among participants by the end of the program reached 94%, and the increase in family income generated by the training was 70%.

In addition, the Public School Support Program provided training to 90,000 teachers, indirectly impacting half a million students across Brazil. Mentoring initiatives that promote exchanges between young people and professionals engaged 1,050 participants, and we mobilized 1,200 volunteers. Through the Technology Training Program and the University Support Program, we directly served 80 and 56 young people, respectively.

These positive figures represent, in reality, opportunities created for young people to break cycles of social vulnerability and build a future of autonomy and expanded horizons. In this sense, 2025 was an important year in confirming that we can aim even higher when our educational methodology is supported by partners committed to social transformation.

This collaborative effort also led to recognitions and awards that energize us to pursue new goals in 2026. The Best NGOs initiative (Melhores ONGs) recognized Instituto Reciclar as the Best NGO in Income Generation for the third year and, for the first time, as the Best NGO in Local Development. This also marked the ninth consecutive year that Instituto Reciclar was selected as one of the 100 best NGOs in Brazil.

Additionally, for the sixth consecutive year, we received the Human Rights and Diversity Seal, awarded by the São Paulo City Hall for our Educational Program. We concluded the year by receiving the Professor Paulo Nathanael de Souza Trophy, granted by the Centro de Integração Empresa-Escola (CIEE), in recognition of our impact on youth through education.

In the following pages, we present the main results of our mission to transform realities. Our deepest gratitude goes to everyone who supports us daily and makes this work possible.

Instituto Reciclar exists to empower new realities for young people. Providing high-quality education for innovation, aligned with workplace trends, is our way of fostering economic inclusion as a driver of social transformation. The year 2025 was remarkable for Instituto Reciclar, both for the results achieved and, above all, for the significance of completing 30 years of work. This historic milestone shaped our actions throughout the year in many ways. Among the highlights was our Beneficiary Dinner and Auction, an emblematic moment to celebrate our history, present our current achievements, and envision the future we are building. On this occasion, we paid tribute to the individuals who have made, and continue to make, a difference since the founding of Instituto Reciclar, reaffirming that our impact is the result of three decades of collective effort.

We believe in the potential of young people to transform the world, which is why we work with a strong focus on collaboration and respect for each individual. At the

same time, we aim to prepare young people to reflect on and act upon global challenges. For this reason, our educational methodology is intrinsically connected to five of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): No Poverty; Quality Education; Gender Equality; and Decent Work and Economic Growth.

We understand that each young person brings a unique perspective that drives transformation. To expand our impact, we offer diverse learning opportunities through a range of programs. Our initiatives span from the Educational Program, a long-term project, to multiplication initiatives that extend our methodology across several Brazilian states. We operate on multiple fronts: supporting public education, strengthening the training of professionals in higher education, and developing specialists in technology.

The past year has shown us that strong partnerships can take our mission even further, whether in São Paulo or in other regions of the country. Across Brazil, we find people willing to dedicate their time, knowledge, and talent because they believe in the change we promote.

Our Model of Impact Educational Program



The Educational Program offers technical, human and socioemotional training for young people aged 15 to 19, with the goal of promoting their workforce development. We aim to broaden their perspectives through activities that involve real problem-solving. This way, young people are challenged to create and manage projects that promote social transformation.

In addition to being part of the institute's curricula, the young people are enrolled in vocational courses, all fully funded by the organization, in diverse areas according to their choices, always in accredited institutions, such as Albert Einstein and Senac.

YEAR I

Creative Solutions Workshops + Life Project + Support Workshops + Special Activities

YEAR II

Vocational Training + Mentoring + Educational Platform + Support Workshops

YEAR III

Vocational Training + Mentoring + Employability Support



Creative Solutions Workshops

Provides learning through project management based on real problems, with the goal of training young people for the workplace reality.



Life Project

Encourages reflection on personal and professional dreams, tracing goals to achieve them and choosing a career path to follow.



Support Workshops

Supports the development of socioemotional and cognitive skills, as well as improving educational levels in Portuguese, English, Mathematics, Logical Reasoning, technology and vocational training. It also prepares participants for entering the job market.



Vocational Training

Based on the life project designed in the first year, young people begin their vocational formation at reference institutions in their chosen area, with all expenses covered by Instituto Reciclar.



Mentoring

Connects experienced professionals with the young people, supporting them in facing the challenges in entering the job market and developing soft skills.



Employability Support

Supports young people's entry into the job market in positions aligned with their vocational training through partnering companies.

By the end of three years, young people trained by the Educational Program have the ability to develop projects, work collaboratively, possess an enriched cultural repertoire, earn a technical diploma and a solid human development.

To evaluate the **Educational Program's impact**, in addition to our employability indicators, we developed a methodology to measure the development of socioemotional skills promoted by the workshops, comparing participants' competencies at entry and at the end of the program.

Through this replicable social methodology, we achieved the following results in 2025 regarding the development of soft skills among our youth:

Our Model of Impact

Public School Support Program

The **Public School Support Program (PAEP)** aims to share the technical expertise developed by Instituto Reciclar, in various areas of educational knowledge, with educators from public school systems across Brazil, completely free of charge. It is organized into five main axes that support educators to approach these topics with the students. They are:



EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY

Develops competencies of learnings, using and creating digital information technologies and using digital languages as a form of communication and expression.



LIFE PROJECT

Promotes connection with the world of work and the development of autonomy and protagonism for decision-making, fostering critical awareness and responsibility.



SOCIOEMOTIONAL COMPETENCIES

Enhances the development of abilities and soft skills that allow educators to address the diversity of individuals during the teaching process.



PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND INNOVATION

Encourages project management and administrative skills for everyday school planning aiming to achieve innovation through tools that facilitate school work and organization. It also enables the conduction of teamwork focused on problem-solving and the development of critical thinking.



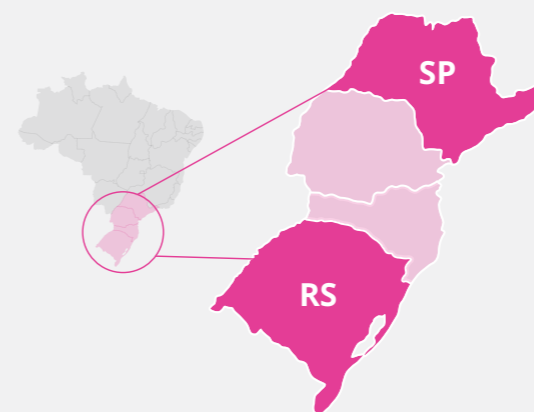
MENTAL HEALTH

Through health-promoting practices, exercises and targeted actions, this axis fosters a welcoming, safe and collaborative school environment, supporting students' emotional and cognitive development within learning spaces.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR WORK IN 2025

PAEP's expansion to Porto Alegre included the implementation of the Unplugged Programming (Programação Desplugada) project within the Educational Technology axis. The municipal school system also received the "Aluno Monitor" workshop, designed to develop young people's skills in Digital Citizenship. In São Paulo, this work resulted in the Cyber Pirates initiative.

Additionally, we supported the São Paulo state school system in developing teacher training materials for the Life Project axis, which were applied with students.

Our Model of Impact

Mentoring Program



The Mentoring Program aims to support young people aged 15 to 29 through the development of soft skills aligned with workplace needs, increasing their employability.

The program engages experienced professionals who share their knowledge through volunteer mentorship.

Instituto Reciclar uses its own social technology, called Mentú, a platform containing exclusive content designed to support the development of soft skills and other abilities relevant to the professional world. Mentú also includes management and monitoring tools, maintained by the program team.

We work with vulnerable youth and a diverse audience, in addition to young professionals in companies (interns and apprentices), reaching participants across Brazil.

Our Model of Impact

University Support Program



The **University Support Program** is a way for Instituto Reciclar to remain present in young people’s education as they enter higher education and throughout their academic journey.

Aimed at participants who have completed the Educational Program, the University Support offers non-repayable grants to cover tuition fees at private higher education institutions or pre-university preparatory courses, as well as a stipend to support living expenses at public universities.

In this way, Instituto Reciclar ensures that young people have access to high-quality education, contributing to their comprehensive development and preparing them for qualified entry into the job market. Additionally, participants have the opportunity to break cycles of vulnerability and become agents of social transformation.



In 2025, 56 young people were attended by the program, receiving scholarships for various courses:

Our Model of Impact

Technology Training Program

The **Technology Training Program** aims to meet the growing demand for professionals in the technology sector who not only possess technical expertise but also the soft skills and socioemotional competencies required in the workplace.

The program is designed for young people aged 14 to 19, enrolled in public schools, and combines in-person and online learning.

In 2025, we trained 80 young people from Escola Eurípedes Simões de Paula in São Paulo. Training took place at the school, through an online programming course offered by SENAC, and via two online courses available on the Reciclar Platform.

By the end of the program, participants are able to use programming tools and proactively engage in professional activities. They complete the program prepared to create a resume, participate in selection processes, and demonstrate the skills necessary for effective communication in the workplace.

Additionally, participants receive ongoing employability support, with their resumes forwarded to positions at partnering companies.

Our Model of Impact

Reciclar Platform



Launched in 2024, the Reciclar Platform is a social technology developed to expand our reach. This digital tool offers content dedicated to the professional development of young aged 14 to 19.

With a variety of formative pathways and interactive content, the Platform focuses on developing socioemotional competencies and technical skills for the workplace. By promoting reskilling and upskilling for growth and transformation, we connect the young people to a promising professional future.

The more than 50 courses available covers topics such as organizational culture, project management, innovation and English language, providing comprehensive training.



In addition to serving internal audiences from partner companies, such as young apprentices and interns in professional qualification programs, the Platform also supports workforce development for historically marginalized groups, including Black, Indigenous, women, and members of the LGBTQIAPN+ community, preparing them for professional opportunities.

This digital environment has been essential for enabling learning through applied projects across the country, from municipalities in the interior of Bahia to state capitals such as Porto Alegre (Rio Grande do Sul) and Belém (Pará).



In 2025, we reached 8,500 young people through the Reciclar Platform.

Our Model of Impact

Multiplication Program



The Multiplication Program is an initiative to take our methodology to other social organizations and locations. Through this program, we expanded our impact to 1,605 young people, opening new paths and opportunities in the workplace.



In 2025, the following multiplication projects were implemented:



FUNDAÇÃO TIDE SETUBAL - São Paulo

2025 was a milestone for the second edition of the Asas Project, in partnership with Fundação Tide Setubal. The initiative brings our educational methodology and workforce development actions to young people from the Eastern region of São Paulo, at Galpão ZL, in the Jardim Lapenna neighborhood.

The project trained young people aged 15 to 24 from April to December. In addition to developing socioemotional and technical skills, the program also focused on abilities required in the workplace. To achieve this, participants attended courses in Reading, Writing and Oral Communication, Logical Reasoning and Mathematics, English, Theater, Tools for the World of Work, and Creative Solutions Workshops.

One of the principles of our methodology is to contextualize learning by connecting theoretical topics with real workplace situations. Through this approach, young people understand the relevance and applicability of what they are learning, increasing motivation and engagement in the learning process.

Participants complete the program with enhanced empathy, effective communication, and problem-solving skills. This learning, supported by collective knowledge construction, fosters lasting personal and professional growth.

INSTITUTO LINA GALVANI - Bahia

In partnership with Instituto Lina Galvani, we developed the Conecta Jovem Project, bringing our methodology and expertise to four different territories in the state of Bahia: Luís Eduardo Magalhães, Angico dos Dias, Irecê, and Rio das Ondas Settlement.

The initiative, which began in 2025 and will continue in 2026, provides professional and socioemotional training for 180 young people aged 15 to 18. The project is structured around three main pillars:

- Technology Training;
- Reciclar Platform learning pathway, including modules in Life Project, Communication, and Tools for the World of Work;
- Mentoring with experienced professionals.

The project is designed to promote formal job opportunities and address issues such as the lack of professional qualification and school dropout in areas outside large urban centers.

AMCHAM BRASIL - Belém (PA) e Rio Grande do Sul

Through a partnership with the American Chamber of Commerce in Brazil (Amcham Brasil), we implemented the Mais Caminhos Project in Belém and in the state of Rio Grande do Sul.

In Belém, the capital of Pará, we offered mentoring and English programs (basic and intermediate levels), coordinating with local institutions to mobilize young people and reach specific populations, including young women and quilombola communities. The actions were supported by UNICEF, Instituto BEI, and the State Department of Education, through a project developed by Usina da Paz and Fundação ParáPaz.

In Rio Grande do Sul, we offered English language training, supported by six institutions connected through Amcham Brasil:

The Centro de Integração Empresa-Escola (CIEE) highlighted the impact of the Educational Program in preparing young people for the job market through training in soft skills and vocational education. The CIEE award recognizes institutions and individuals who transform youth through education.



BRAZIL'S BEST NGO IN INCOME GENERATION

In 2025, Instituto Reciclar received this distinction for the third time through the Best NGOs Award. This recognition further validates the results of our methodology in promoting productive inclusion through youth training.

BRAZIL'S BEST NGO IN LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

Instituto Reciclar was recognized in this category for the first time. The award highlights the importance of our work being directly connected to the territory and the communities we serve, particularly in the Jaguaré neighborhood of São Paulo, where our headquarters are located.



100 BEST NGOS SEAL

For the ninth consecutive year, we are among the 100 best NGOs in Brazil. In addition to defending important causes, the organizations recognized on this list stand out for working according to high standards in four pillars: management, governance, financial sustainability, and transparency.

DIVERSITY AND HUMAN RIGHTS SEAL

This recognition, awarded by the São Paulo City Hall, highlighted the impact of our Educational Program on workforce development for young people. 2025 marked the sixth consecutive year that Instituto Reciclar received this acknowledgment from the city of São Paulo.
